Helendale Community Park

The Helendale Community Park is open 7 days a week from dawn to dusk. The park is open to the public (no ID cards required). There are a variety of activities to do at the park, we have an RC car track, fitness stations, playground, two sand volleyball courts, horseshoe pits, picnic areas, open grass areas to play sports and two baseball fields. The park is located at 15425 Wild Rd.

No Drugs Down the Drain

Flushing unused medications down the toilet or sink was once common practice, but now we know that it is better for the environment to keep these substances out of the drain and out of the trash. Instead, bring your medications to a drug takeback location that will safely dispose of nearly all drugs free of charge. Visit www.dontrushtoflush.org to find the nearest site. You may also take your medications to your nearest pharmacy for disposal.

Medications enter the sewer system and wind up at wastewater treatment plants in two ways: (1) human excretion, and (2) disposal of medications down the drain. Wastewater treatment plants remove most pollutants; however, not all medications are entirely removed. The levels of medication are small enough that they do not normally pose a threat to public health and the environment. To keep our treated water safe, please dispose of unwanted medications at a drug takeback location near you and encourage others to do the same. Source: www.nodrugsdownthedrain.org/
