

Did you know?

- Helendale CSD offers two free bulky item pick ups per year. Each pick up is good for up to 5 items. Call the office to schedule your appointment. If you are recycling a mattress it will need to be in a mattress bag, which are available to purchase at the CSD office for \$2.50.
- You can recycle your yard waste at the Thrift Store everyday from 11:00 am to 3:00 pm by appointment, call the office to schedule. *Some restrictions apply.*
- Mattresses and e-waste can be brought to the Thrift Store for recycling.
- Your bill is due by the 10th of every month; however you have until the last business day of the month to make your payment. A late payment fee will be assessed on the first day of the month for any unpaid balances.
- You can make your payment online, by phone, by mail or in the office. See our website www.helendalecsd.org for all the ways you can pay.
- If your trash barrel is broken, you can call the office for a replacement.
- If your trash and/or recycling is not picked up, please call the office on the following day. Please note, your barrels must be at the curb by 6:00 am on your service day to be picked up.
- Burrtec waste offers walk up service for elderly/disabled customers. Call the office to set up this service.
- Customers can get four dump passes every month good for up to 500 pounds each. Call the office to request your pass and it will be ready for pick up when you arrive!

As the weather cools down, grass, shrubs, and trees need less water. Reduce the amount of time and the number of days per week that you water.

What is FOG?

FOG stands for Fats, Oils and Grease. You may not think much of scraping your leftover food or cooking grease into the sink, but it can cause trouble for your pipes and the community sewer system.

Some common FOG found in kitchens includes cooking oils, condiments such as salad dressings and sandwich spreads, meat juices and fat, butter, lard, shortening and bacon grease. When FOG is poured down the drain and garbage disposals, it can cause blockages that can cause the sewer to back up into your home or business through sinks, drains and toilets. Here are a few simple things you can do to avoid sewage blockage and increased treatment costs:

- Do not pour fats, oils, or grease down the drain –Cool it, can it and trash it instead! Pour used cooking oil and grease into a can or another sealable container and throw it in the trash when cool.
- Wipe down greasy dishes, pots and pans and cooking utensils with a paper towel and dispose of it in your garbage.
- Use a strainer to catch food scraps and throw them in the trash.
