## How to Help the Homeless

Everyone can do something to help the homeless

#### Shelter:

Help provide essential services for the homeless by donating to organizations who specialize in this, such as Salvation Army or Victor Valley Rescue Mission. Many churches in the High Desert provide homeless services as well.

### Food:

Make goodie bags of snacks and hand them out. (Handing out cash is not recommended.) Carry bottles of water to hand out. Donate to a local food pantry or community soup kitchen. Following are some organizations to consider: Helendale Community Church; Barstow at St. Joseph's; Desert Manna; Desert Sanctuary; in Victorville at the Gate Church, Rescue Mission or Salvation Army; in Apple Valley at Church of the Valley.

## Warmth:


Take those old sleeping bags you have not used and donate to a local shelter or church that serves the homeless. Place them on a park bench where you have seen the homeless. Add a jacket, sweat pants or gloves to the bundle. Socks are always needed!



## HOW IS SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY DOING?

There were 4,195 adults and children who were counted as homeless during the January 2023 Pointin Time Count and Survey. The previous point-in-time homeless count and survey was completed in 2022 during which 3,333 persons were counted. A comparison of last two counts reveals that:

- 862 more persons were counted in 2023, which represents an increase of 25.9%
- 587 more persons were counted as unsheltered in 2023 when compared to the unsheltered count in 2022, which represents an increase of 24.6%
- 275 more persons were counted as sheltered in 2023 when compared to the sheltered count in 2022, which represents an increase of 29.1%.
